THE FAMILY OF GOD

FAMILY A man's wife had deserted him for another man. She succeeded in taking away their children. The estranged husband became depressed & lost his business.

Brokenhearted & ruined, he became obsessed with the enormity of his troubles & refused every offer of encouragement & hope. GOOD FOR CHILDREN

RELIGION IS Children with religious parents are better behaved & appear happier than children reared by parents without the influence of religious faith, a new study has shown.

The first study to examine the impact of religion on the development of young children was authored by John Bartkowski, a sociologist with Mississippi State University. Bartkowski's team questioned the parents & teachers of more than 16,000 children, asking the adults to rate the children—most of them age six—on self-control, frequency of poor or unhappy behavior, & their ability to respect & work with peers. The results were compared to the parents' rate of attendance at church services, how frequently they talked about faith with their child, &whether or not there was arguing over religion in the home.

The children of parents who regularly attended church services & talked with their child about religion were rated by both parents & teachers as showing better behavior, self-control skills, & social skills than children from non-religious families. Children whose parents both attended church regularly were rated as having the best behavior & being the most well-adjusted.

LESSONS IN LEADERSHIP

BURNT When I was a child, mom would make breakfast food **BISCUITS** for dinner every now and then. And I remember one

night in particular when she had made breakfast after a long, hard day at work. On that evening so long ago, my mom placed a plate of eggs, sausage, and extremely burned biscuits in front of my dad. I remember waiting to see if anyone noticed! Yet all my dad did was reach for his biscuit, smile at my mom and ask me how my day was at school. I don't remember what I told him that night, but I do remember watching him smear butter and jelly on that biscuit and eat every bite!

When I got up from the table that evening, I remember hearing my mom apologize to my dad for burning the biscuits. And I'll never forget what he said: "Honey, I love burned biscuits."

Later that night, I went to kiss Daddy good night and I asked him if he really liked his biscuits burned. He wrapped me in his arms and said, "Your Momma put in a hard day at work today and she's real tired. And besides—a little burnt biscuit never hurt anyone!"

You know, life is full of imperfect things . . . and imperfect people. I'm not the best at hardly anything, and I forget birthdays and anniversaries just like everyone else. What I've learned over the years is that learning to accept each other's faults—and choosing to celebrate each other's differences—is one of the most important keys to creating a healthy, growing, and lasting relationship.

And that's my prayer for you today. That you will learn to take the good, the bad, and the ugly parts of your life and lay them at the feet of God. Because in the end, He's the only One who will be able to give you a relationship where a burnt biscuit isn't a dealbreaker!

We could extend this to any relationship. In fact, understanding is the base of any relationship, be it a husband-wife or parentchild or friendship. Someone said, "Don't put the key to your happiness in someone else's pocket—keep it in your own."

So please pass me a biscuit, and yes, the burnt one will do just fine.
